President's Report David Rylance

Elwood LSC members have been busy over the last 12 months delivering regular patrols, providing water safety for special events, delivering the junior program, conducting member training, participating in competition, and participating in other community activities. Elwood LSC runs programs, participates in lifesaving sport and is available for emergency callouts year-round. Whilst we only actively patrol from November to April, we are available to assist with any emergency when requested or when members are presented with a medical emergency as some of our members were after the end of the patrol season this year.

Our patrollers did a great job again this season, completing more than 3,000 hours of patrolling which included our normal rostered patrols, junior activities water safety, carnival water safety and special event water safety. This season we again dealt with many minor first aids and several major first aids that required an ambulance. Thank you to all our patrollers who volunteer their time to ensure that Elwood beachgoers are safe.

Our Junior Program continues to provide vital open water education to the more than 300 juniors who are enrolled. The popularity of our program is proven through the large waiting list of people wanting to join. We currently have a cap on the number of juniors enrolled to ensure we can provide a quality program with the facilities and resources we have available. For this program to work, we need a lot of volunteers, from qualified members to provide water safety, age manage and coach to BBQ helpers, uniform sales, and a junior program coordinator. The ability for the club to continue to run the junior program relies heavily on volunteers helping on the day.

The club was again successful in obtaining grants to allow us to purchase new equipment for patrols, training, competition, water safety and general items around the club. The grants along with support from our sponsors and the funds from water safety events and BBQs means we can provide up-to-date and safe equipment for our members.

Well done to all our members who have participated in lifesaving carnivals. We had members participate in summer carnivals, IRB competition and pool competition. We achieved great results in the events that ran with a number of members receiving medals at State and National championships. The IRB team continues to achieve great results and our juniors did a great job in the summer and during pool competition with many competitors making finals and achieving podium finishes.

Elwood LSC continues to have members in state and national roles in addition to their club positions. They do a great job in representing Elwood LSC and the lifesaving movement.

During the season, James Newbury MP, met with some of our committee members, which gave us a chance to discuss some of the issues we face, including long outstanding building maintenance issues and the recent changes to the City of Port Phillip's (CoPP) parking policy. We were grateful for the assistance that Mr Newbury provided to follow up the CoPP on these issues, which aided in the resolution of the majority of these.

I thank everyone for their help in making the club what it is and look forward to the coming season.

Treasurer's Report

2024 Financial Year (FY) Highlights

- Net surplus of \$39,536 (\$47,061 net surplus in 2023FY)
- Cash at bank and term deposit \$301,714 (\$323,198 in 2023FY)
- Total grants \$68,930 (\$69,604 in 2023FY)
- Revenue from water safety events \$29,196 (\$39,796 in 2023FY)
- Net profit on Nipper BBQ takings \$9,147 (\$5,852 in 2023FY)

The club is in a strong cash and financial position. The cash is high but this is to take advantage of any future grants for which we must match or meet certain cash requirements to be eligible to receive them.

Many thanks to the water safety team which again worked extremely hard to bring these important funds into the club. We especially recognise these efforts given the challenges with meeting patrol requirements and covering additional patrol shifts.

The Nippers program was highly attended and well supported. Many thanks to Georgie Park-Beard for coordinating again and to the committee members, parents and other volunteers for their ongoing assistance in running this important program. Huge thanks also to the parents and other volunteers running the weekly BBQ which was a great success again.

The remaining 2023/2024 VESEP grant is being carried over due to delivery delays with the motors and the IRB. We expect these to be delivered by August 2024 and January 2025 respectively, at which time we will claim the grant component applicable. Details of the grants received during the year are further below. Thanks again to Wes Hosking for his continued efforts in looking out and applying for grants as they are a vital source of revenue for the club. Thanks also to the club captain and patrol captains for their timely lodgement of patrol reports and communications to allow us to receive the LSV administration grants.

Secretary's Report

Rachael Rylance

The 2023/24 season was busy across all areas of the club including administration to ensure we met our reporting and compliance obligations with Life Saving Victoria, the City of Port Phillip and regulatory bodies. Despite some challenges this season with meeting patrol obligations, most of the KPIs that we have set against our strategic plan were met, which is pleasing and keeps the club in a good position coming into the 2024/25 season.

Our membership numbers were the most we have ever seen, which was assisted by continued high numbers enrolled for our Nippers program. Numbers of patrolling members recovered a little from last season, but we still need to focus on attracting and retaining these members to continue providing our vital services over summer and take some of the burden off our key volunteers.

The final official membership number for the 2023/24 season was 940, broken down as follows:

Junior Activity members 5-13 years old x 338 (329 enrolled in Nippers)
Cadet members 13-15 years old x 24
Active members 15-18 years old x 41
Active members 18 years old & over x 61
General members x 311
Associate members x 18
Probationary (No Working with Children Check confirmation received) x 120
Life members x 27

The number of members aged 18 and over not fully complying with the requirement to have a current Working with Children Check (WWCC) with Elwood LSC listed as an organisation continues to be a challenge and is a key focus for the club. We would greatly appreciate everyone's co-operation in complying with this requirement, as the club continues its commitment to upholding the Safeguarding Children Standards.

The committee is continuing its review of all club policies and procedures and the drafting of club bylaws. We also have a strategic planning day scheduled for late August to review our current strategic plan, risk register and plan for the season ahead.

Life Saving Victoria (LSV) is currently conducting a governance review, which involves a review by external consultants who have presented a set of recommendations for changes to the governance structure of LSV. This is an ongoing piece of work and it is expected to take some time to implement any changes. The committee and our members have had the opportunity to provide feedback on the recommendations and LSV has formed a Governance Review Working Group to consider all feedback. They will then provide advice to the LSV Governance Committee and LSV Board as to which recommendations should be implemented.

During the season we communicated that City of Port Phillip (CoPP) made some significant changes to their Parking Policy, which has impacted the number of permits available to our members. We have met with CoPP a number of times and a revision to the policy was passed at a Council meeting in May. The result was an increase from 33 to 35 Foreshore Club Parking Permits being available to our members, and ten Club Parking Permits for our key volunteers. The club's view is that this is still not enough to cater for our continued growth in membership and we are continuing to explore other avenues to lobby CoPP to increase the number of permits available for our members. The

process for applying for permits will also change this season and we will communicate this to members in the coming weeks.

I'd once again like to thank the other members of the committee for their support and commitment to the success of the club. I look forward to another very successful season coming up.

Club Captain's Report

Thank you, two small words which don't express enough gratitude to acknowledge all those who patrolled over the season including the patrol captains and vice captains for their leadership to our five patrol teams, and those who filled in the gaps. For those who gained their awards and patrolled for the first time this season, I hope you enjoyed your experience and look forward to you patrolling with Elwood for many years to come, and the friendships you may have, which makes us 'A Club for Life'.

Elwood Life Saving Club patrolled the 2023/2024 season which commenced on 11 November 2023 and concluded on 14 April 2024, fulfilling our obligations agreed within the Life Saving Victoria services protocol. Again, no patrol audits were carried out during this season. It is now standard practice that clubs are on standby from the beginning of November to the end of April, with temperature triggers in place.

The patrolling hours consisted of the club's requirement to patrol on weekends, public holidays and providing water safety for triathlons, carnivals, the Nippers program and club training. We again relied on a small number of dedicated members patrolling far more than is desirable to achieve an optimal work/life balance to maintain our obligations.

We also opened our training to members from other clubs and had a number join us from all over the state in our training courses During the 2023/24 season we again partnered with Elwood College to provide Bronze training to Year 10 students. This had the students complete the training as an elective during school hours as part of their outdoor education classes. The program was able to be completed this season with most participants successfully gaining their Bronze Medallion.

IRB Captain's Report

Elwood LSC depends heavily on the operation of IRBs for patrols as well as Nippers and triathlon water safety events. The three rescues conducted this season were all done using an IRB. Our patrol IRB also responded to an incident at St Kilda, proving how valuable to operations these assets are.

Maintenance and upkeep of IRBs, motors, propellers and ancillary equipment has been undertaken both in house by ELSC members as well as external specialists. We thank TRE Motorsport for the service and tuning of motors as well as providing ancillary equipment. We also thank the team at Precision Propellors for the maintenance of IRB propellors.

Elwood LSC added two new motors with propellors to its gear shed this year, which were purchased through a VESEP grant. This enables the club to turnover two of our oldest motors, one of which has been sold along with our oldest IRB, RLH4 to the Beaumaris Sea Scouts. We also sold two patrol propellors to Black Rock LSC.

This season only the new specification IRBs could be used for competition, which meant that our two Gen III Thundercats were used for competition for the first time, and our fleet of Gen II Thundercats have been put to use for water safety and training new IRB crews and drivers.

First Aid Officer's Report

There were a number of first aid incidents this season which our patrollers handled with both skill and professionalism.

In all we recorded 750 preventatives and tended to 10 first aid cases. The low first aid figure can in part be attributed to the club's continued efforts to increase safety awareness and knowledge both among members and the broader public. While club members did a fantastic job preventing first aid incidents and creating an opportunity for educationit is important to flag that all members must fill out correct documentation following any incident. These procedures need to be filled out in pen and completed in a timely manner. It is also important to note members should be accompanied by a fellow member when attending to first aids. This not only ensures you are safe but means additional assistance is available if needed.

In recent months we have had a handover in first aid roles, warmly welcoming our new first aid officer Kim Ruhl. Kim is a nurse with numerous years of experience in dealing with first aid cases and equipment. She has lots of new ideas ready to be placed into action and I hope you will make her welcome around the club.

Thank you to all patrollers who have assisted and treated a first aid this season. Your work is very much appreciated.

Nippers Report

Life Saving Victoria's 2023/24 Nippers program was an incredible success with 12,478 children taking part statewide. At Elwood 329 Nippers took part, making it the most attended season of the program in club history. With impeccable weather for the majority of the season, the Nippers had the ability to gain confidence and rapidly grow their skills each week. A big thank you to Chisholm & Gamon for their sponsorship of our Nippers long sleeved T-shirts again this season. It's great to receive such wonderful support from our local businesses. We also thank Community Bank Elwood for its continued support in funding vital equipment like Nippers boards.

Of the 329 Nippers participants, 247 (75%) achieved their Surf Education award as follows:

Our regular training sessions on Monday and Wednesday evenings continued. These sessions are a great way for our members to stay fit, improve their skills and stay connected year-round. The number of members attending training sessions was fairly consistent and it was great to see a mix of juniors, seniors and parents taking part. These sessions are aimed at those wishing to compete in carnivals and focus on technique, fitness and competition skills.

It was pleasing to see a number of juniors take to the water and sand again for the LSV carnival season. Elwood was proudly represented by 17 of junior members at the Victorian Junior State Championships, held in Warrnambool from March 8-10. Our team of Abi Ruhl, Alessia Collins, Freja Bohme, Victoria Bracken, Charlie Ironmonger, Aurora Freund, Maxwell Collins, Max Golenkov, Finlay Montgomery, Aarya Ekanayake, Frankie Hyde, Isla Clouting, Isla Montgomery, Patrick Collins, Jonah Rey, Miriam Cunliffe and Stella Collins, showed amazing determination and achieved some fantastic results with everyone in the team making finals across the weekend. As a club we achieved the best result we have seen for Junior State Champs, placing 11th overall. The training and hard work the team put in to prepare was highlighted with three gold medals, a silver medal, two bronze medals and a number of top 10 finishes.

The IRB team had smaller numbers this season, after several athletes from Black Rock LSC who had been competing with us over the last few seasons, returned to race under the Black Rock cap. We finished 5th overall in the 2024 Junior Pool Championships, which was a great result for a team of only five athletes. The Senior Pool Championships are scheduled for 22nd September and we hope to be well represented at this. Carla Drury and Nell Peat will also be competing at the Lifesaving World Championships being held at the Gold Coast Aquatic Centre in early September.

I would like to personally thank all our officials who assisted at carnivals this season – Amanda Drury, David Warren, Michael Hyde, Peter Hosken, Michael Corrigan, Nicola Harrop and David Laws from Black Rock LSC. Our teams would not be able to compete without the dedication of these individuals. I would also like to thank everyone who assisted with our water safety duties at junior and senior carnivals. Building Sub-CommitteeChristine Evely

The Elwood Life Saving Club committee submission to the City of Port Phillip (CoPP), in response to the council's proposed 10-year site plan for the Elwood foreshore precinct, outlined our concerns including the location of a new lifesaving clubhouse off the foreshore, a separate lookout tower further along the beach, and moving and reducing the parking area. The council provided a revised broad plan indicating that our submission, meetings, and discussions with councillors and City of Port Phillip staff have, at least in part, been considered. The revised foreshore proposal can be viewed at: Elwood foreshore: Looking to the future - City of Port Phillip

The club committee is committed to working with the City of Port Phillip and other relevant authorities to achieve a purpose-built and sustainable building and associated facilities. The committee will specify in detail the number, sizes and location of all areas of a purpose-built building and its associated facilities, and in particular will consider critical elements required for emergency service delivery, including key characteristics such as beach visitation, club membership and growth, and our current and aspirational connections with the wider community. It is vital that beach access enables our lifesavers to deploy equipment as quickly and safely as possible to ensure the wellbeing of any persons in danger.

There is no current plan for building development and any new Elwood Life Saving Club facilities will rely on the ability of the City of Port Phillip and club to secure very significant funding support. There are no known budgetary provisions at any government level for building development to meet the current or future needs of Elwood Life Saving Club.




